### Today's Reflection: celebrations upon celebrations!

Though our journey as a nation has been riddled with diverse challenges, pains, and even tragedies, we yet give God thanks, for gratitude is His will for us. ## JESUS IS PRESENT IN THE MEAL

And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. Matthew 26:26

### Today's Reflection: knowledge is key.

The Holy Communion is a spiritual mystery that not many believers have come to realize. It is a meal instituted by the Lord Himself and commanded to be done in remembrance of Him. It is therefore absolutely important that we seek deeper knowledge regarding this sacred ritual. This meal goes beyond symbolic representation of what Jesus our Lord did for us in His death, burial, and resurrection. Rather, it carries real-time significance every time we partake of it.

As the Lord instituted the Communion, He made this clear statement — "This is my body." At that table, what the Lord held in His hand was physical bread, yet He called it His body. If the bread was His body at that time, it therefore continues to be His body forever. The Communion we partake in today is not inferior to the one the Lord shared with His disciples on the night before He was crucified. Though there are arguments about the form in which Jesus is present in the meal, what should interest us is the reality of His presence in the meal we share.

Such revelation gives believers the true worth and sacredness of the Communion. Is this not why the Bible warns us not to take the bread, which is the Body of Christ, and the wine, which is the Blood of Christ, in an unworthy manner? (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). The Bible urges us to examine ourselves before eating the bread and drinking the cup so that we do not bring judgment upon ourselves — evaluating our spiritual state, ensuring that we are true believers, repentant of sin, and walking in genuine love for others while remembering the sacrifice of Christ. This is a meal no true believer should miss.

Prayers: Father, help me to recognize the meaning of the Lord's body.

## FRIDAY 3

## PETER'S MISTAKE

But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me, because you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but on man's." — Matthew 16:23 NET

### Today's Reflection: something to ponder on!

Often we don't realize how far off the mark we are on important matters. In fact, in such instances we may be so passionate about our stance because we sincerely think we are right. Such was the case with Peter in our opening verse. It was a commendable show of affection for our Lord Jesus as He revealed to them how He was going to suffer much at the hands of the Jewish leaders and be killed. It was natural for Peter to rebuke Jesus — he loved his Lord and could not bear to hear Him speak of death. See how harmless what Peter said seemed: "Heaven forbid, Lord," he said. "This will never happen to you!" (Matthew 16:22 NLT).

However, the verdict of eternity was that Peter had veered awfully off course when brought before the light of the will of God. Peter wanted to 'save' his Master from dying, while the Father's superior will was to save humanity from perishing. Satan sought to take advantage of Peter's human-centered interest to derail the Father's plan. But our Lord Jesus, who knew the Father's will, countered Peter's rebuke, exalting the will of the Father above Peter's mere human concerns.

Here's the lesson for us: even as spiritual Christians, we must keep in mind that the thoughts of God are always higher than ours (Isaiah 55:8–9). They are eternal in perspective, while our best thoughts are mundane and temporal. Knowing this, we must be humble at all times to seek God's will in all matters, lest we clash with God's supreme will — darkening His counsel with words without knowledge (Job 38:2). Let us always learn to subject our dispositions on matters to the Holy Spirit for guidance (Romans 8:14).

Prayers: Lord, help me to always know Your mind and side with Your interest.

## THE NEW MAN

Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. - 2 Corinthians 5:17

Today's Reflection: Who we are.

What the new birth made us into is something many believers have not fully grasped. But thanks be to God who continues to enlighten us by His Spirit. The principle of the Spirit's work is this: the more we know, the more we become (Colossians 3:10; John 8:32; 2 Corinthians 3:18). Eternal life itself is God's gift, received through faith and knowledge (John 17:3). Sadly, many Christians remain limited by lack of understanding. Jesus once said to the people of His day: "Your error is caused by your ignorance of the Scriptures and of God's power!" (Matthew 22:29, TLB).

Beloved, the new birth made us into a new creation in Christ. The old life passed away; a new life has begun. This is how God now sees us, and by faith, we must learn to see ourselves the same way. Remember always: the moment we believe in the Lord Jesus and confess Him as Lord, God forgives and justifies us—He counts us righteous in Christ (Romans 10:10; 5:1). Our old sinful self was crucified with Christ (Romans 6:6), and now we are free from sin's power and control (Romans 6:14, 18).

Now that we are new creatures in Christ, God intends for us to live in righteousness and true holiness (Ephesians 4:24), manifesting the precious fruits of the Spirit so that men may see and glorify God (Galatians 5:22; Matthew 5:16).

Prayer: Lord, thank You that in Christ my past is gone, and my life is new.

## SUNDAY 5

### THANK GOD FOR NIGERIA

I will praise thee, O LORD, among the people: and I will sing praises unto thee among the nations. Psalm 108:3

Today's Reflection: join the challenge.

Nigeria, a great country, a nation so loved and blessed by God. The most populous black nation in the world with over 250 distinct ethnic groups. From its geography to its mineral endowment, its weather and climate — all of these speak of the goodness of God over this nation, leaving every Nigerian with more than enough reasons to continually offer thanks to God.

When we go down memory lane and consider the tortuous history of this great nation, it remains a miracle that we still exist as one united people. There were many raging storms with the potential to tear our nation apart and plunge it into years of war. Yet in the midst of such storms, the God of peace always came through and calmed the tumult. Today, by the mercies of God, Nigeria still stands among the comity of nations as a democratic nation.

Beloved, however deep our challenges, thanksgiving must remain our spiritual posture. We should realize that it could have been far worse but for the mercies of God. Let us choose thanksgiving over murmuring, complaining, and blame-trading. We must keep in mind that except the Lord builds a house, they labour in vain that build it. As we continue in thanksgiving, the merciful God will prevail over our nation. He is able to change times and seasons, and install credible leaders who will steer our country towards His will. So join our little challenge: 21 days of thanksgiving, 5 minutes each day, for our nation Nigeria. Remember, it is a good thing to give thanks to God!

Prayers: Lord, thank You for our great nation, Nigeria.

## THE SOUND

"and it cometh to pass, in thy hearing the sound of a stepping in the tops of the mulberries, then thou dost move sharply, for then hath Jehovah gone out before thee to smite in the camp of the Philistines."

— 2 Samuel 5:24 YLT

### Today's Reflection: divine timing and alignment

After King Saul's death, David became the new king of Israel. When the powerful Philistine army heard about David's coronation, they saw it as a threat and gathered their forces for an attack. Instead of rushing into battle, David first asked God what he should do. God instructed him not to attack them head-on but to circle around behind the enemy. God promised that when David heard a sound like marching in the tops of the mulberry trees, it would be the signal that He had gone before him to strike down the Philistines. David followed God's instructions exactly. When he heard the sound in the trees, he attacked and won a decisive victory.

We too can learn so much from this powerful story. Aside from David's obedient dependence on God and his seeking divine direction, the story highlights another truth: God's divine timing. God is not limited by time, yet He ordains events within time. He acts at appointed moments — kairos moments — and asks us to align with His timing. For David, God gave a sign — "a sound like marching in the tops of the mulberry trees." Beloved, blessed are those who know the joyful sound! If David had moved before or after the sound, he would have fought on his own, without God's help.

The YLT renders God's command as moving "sharply" — meaning David was to act with speed and precision once the signal came. Our prayer must remain that we stay in divine alignment at all times, so that we can move swiftly as God moves. No wonder David had victories everywhere he went. We too can always win, like David, as we follow divine movements.

Prayers: Lord, like David, keep me in divine alignment.



## MAKE THE CHOICE

One person is generous and yet grows more wealthy, but another withholds more than he should and comes to poverty. Proverbs 11:24 NET

### Today's Reflection: the hands that give never run dry.

God told the Israelites to remember that He is the one who gives power to make wealth (Deuteronomy 8:18). Paul in the New Testament tells us, "You know that our Lord Jesus Christ was kind enough to give up all his riches and become poor, so that you could become rich." (2 Corinthians 8:9 CEV). Putting these together confirms the fact that wealth is God's will for His people.

It should be understood that the wealth of believers is a medium to advance God's purposes here on earth. The will of God on the earth oftentimes requires resources to be carried out. Take for example the building of the temple, which was God's will—David and Solomon used their wealth for this purpose (1 Chronicles 29:3). May God's will and purposes find expression through us and all that we have, in Jesus' name!

With this in mind, the Bible goes on to reveal God's way to become wealthy. Central to this is generosity. Our opening verse confirms this truth—givers become wealthy, while those who withhold more than they should come to poverty. Our Lord Jesus taught this clearly: "Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom..." (Luke 6:38). Beloved, do not let anything in this life prevent you from being generous. It may require giving a part of your last meal to someone, like the widow of Zarephath—don't fail to do it. Choose generosity over holding back, and trust God's word to see your resources running over in due time.

Prayers: Lord, I choose to be generous at all times!

## **INCREASE YOUR CAPACITY**



Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations: spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; Isaiah 54:2

### Today's Reflection: prepare the vessel; expect the miracle.

What if your miracle is waiting, not for God's power, but for your capacity? One story makes this truth vivid—the account of the widow of one of the sons of the prophet in 2 Kings 4. This widow had financial troubles that led her to the Prophet Elisha. When she revealed that she had a little oil, the prophet instructed her to go and borrow vessels. Of course, we know how it ended: the little oil miraculously filled all the vessels she borrowed, and only then did it stop.

Our opening verse mirrors this story in a prophetic way. Many times when God wants to do a new thing in our lives, He first requires us to build capacity for what He intends to do. Just as in the story, the widow had only a little oil, yet God demanded that she gather as many vessels as she could. This had to be by faith. Invariably, it was to the extent of the vessels she borrowed that God poured out His supply.

Beloved, this is the learning point. Whenever we are in anticipation of things we trust God for, the waiting seasons are often for capacity building. Are you trusting God for a spiritual outpouring? Then build capacity in prayers, fasting, and study of the Word. Do you trust God for marriage? While you wait, build yourself into the kind of husband or wife everyone would pray to have. Do you trust God for a financial release like that of the widow? Then spend time learning relevant skills, innovating, and providing value people will gladly pay for. Always remember: it is capacity building first before the outpouring.

Prayers: Lord, help me to build capacity.



## **HEARING GOD**

And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee, saying, This is the way, walk ye in it, when ye turn to the right hand, and when ye turn to the left. — Isaiah 30:21

### Today's Reflection: desire to hear Him always.

Hearing God is key in navigating the journey of life. Just as pilots depend on navigation systems to find their way, so must believers be guided by God. Now imagine a pilot whose navigation system blanks out completely, 25,000 feet in the air. Of course, nobody ever wants to be in such a situation.

Jeremiah the prophet spoke with great wisdom when he said, "...our lives are not our own. We are not able to plan our own course." (Jeremiah 10:23 NLT). God wants us to come to this realization quickly. It then means that hearing God consistently becomes non-negotiable. This brings to mind a great Bible figure — Moses, the servant of God. Saddled with the task of leading God's people, he always sought God's direction on all matters. He never relied on his discretion; in all his ways he acknowledged the Lord.

Now, hearing God is not always 'mystical' as people think it to be. It doesn't have to be a big voice or a spectacular encounter. God has multiple channels through which He speaks to His children. He can speak through the Scripture (the Bible), the Holy Spirit (an inner conviction, conscience, or guidance), dreams and visions, angels, the words of other people (especially fellow believers or preachers), and through circumstances and inner experiences like a quiet inner voice or intuition. Beloved, let it become a consistent desire to hear God at all times. This is why we must continue to devote ourselves to prayer, the study of God's word, and fellowship with God's people.

Prayers: Lord, help me to be sensitive to Your voice at all times.

### **SETTLING DISPUTES**



Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God. Matthew 5:9

### Today's Reflection: the goal is reconciliation!

Disputes are a necessary part of our day-to-day experiences. However, what matters as Christians is the way we respond to such situations. As humans, we often have clashes of interest and ideas that build up into disputes. When these disputes are not properly handled, they usually spiral into quarrels that destroy relationships. It is unfortunate how small disputes can destroy decades of peaceful and profitable relationships.

So when disputes arise, what must we do as Christians? The first thing that should come to mind is that as children of God, we are peacemakers. If peace is what we are after, then we must learn God's wisdom of using gentle answers over harsh ones, even when we are provoked. The Bible says a gentle answer turns away wrath (Proverbs 15:1). Truly speaking, it isn't an easy thing to do, but the more we mature in God, the Holy Spirit works on our emotions and temperaments, such that even in the face of provocation, we can still keep our calm.

Next, we must know that our goal in every dispute is not victory but reconciliation. If this must be achieved, then we must set aside personal pride and seek unity with others. We should, however, never forget that seeking peace does not mean overlooking wrongdoing; real reconciliation must also uphold justice and protect the innocent. Thus, we must clothe ourselves with humility and love. We should seek to communicate privately and gently with those we are at odds with. If this isn't working, we can seek out mediators as the Bible recommends (Matthew 18:15–17). Beloved, we are wise peacemakers, children of the living God!

Prayers: Lord, help me to be a peacemaker at all times.



### WITNESSES OF THE TRUTH

Pilate therefore said unto him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice. — John 18:37

### Today's Reflection: stand for the truth of God's word

Beloved, we should forever keep in mind that we remain the only witnesses of truth in this world. We live in a world that is aggressive against the truth. Speaking the truth of the Scripture on certain matters may be labeled as 'hate speech' or judging others. Those who stand for the truth are often demonized, accused, and attacked.

This was a major reason why Jesus was hated by the Jewish leaders. He told them truths they were not comfortable with. He exposed their hypocrisy, love of status, and recognition. Jesus' condemnations of the wrong things they did, known as the "Seven Woes" in Matthew 23, could not go down well with them. No wonder they were bent on killing Him at all costs.

Now this is the lesson. Beloved, if Jesus was hated for bearing witness to the truth, we too must be ready. For servants are not greater than their Master. We cannot betray the truth of God's word because we want to be accepted by the world. We must side with the truth at all times. It doesn't matter how hated the truth of God's word becomes, we must defend it uncompromisingly by the wisdom of the Holy Ghost, just like the apostles did in their days. We are God's defense line for the truth, and we will never lose ground to the enemy.

Prayers: Lord, empower me to forever bear witness to the truth.

## **ADULLAM**



David therefore departed thence, and escaped to the cave Adullam: and when his brethren and all his father's house heard it, they went down thither to him. —1 Samuel 22:1

### Today's Reflection: let's subject ourselves to be discipled

David's story made Adullam an important reference point in the Bible. While fleeing from Saul, he came to a cave in this place and took refuge there. Before long this happened: "Then others began coming—those who were in any kind of trouble, such as being in debt, or merely discontented—until David was the leader of about four hundred men." (1 Samuel 22:2 TLB).

It is believed that the cave of Adullam served as a pivotal training ground where David transformed this group of distressed and discontented men into a loyal and elite fighting force. Spending time with David must have shaped this band of outcasts into mighty warriors, forged into a unit through his leadership and example. A master-and-disciple kind of relationship was likely responsible for this remarkable transformation.

We believe that the church too should be a spiritual Cave Adullam. Just as our Lord Jesus discipled and mentored ordinary fishermen into mighty apostles, so should mere men be transformed into mighty vessels for God. The church must replicate the discipleship system we saw at Adullam and in Jesus' ministry—an intensive, deliberate nurturing where God's people are raised to fit into their high callings and glorious destinies in Him. As individuals, we too must be humble and submit ourselves to be discipled, with a strong desire to be taught, mentored, and raised by genuine believers who have gone ahead of us (1 Corinthians 11:1).

Prayers: Lord, restore effective discipleship systems to our churches.



### THE SPIRIT - FILLED LIFE

This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh. For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would. Galatians 5:16-17

### Today's Reflection: To be Spirit-filled is to yield!

Living a Spirit-filled life means living under the influence, direction, and power of the Holy Spirit every day. It is more than just having the Spirit dwelling within you (which every believer receives at salvation); it is letting Him shape your thoughts, decisions, actions, and character. This is truly the power point of the believer's life. If you desire to see the fullness of a believer's walk—marked by power and the supernatural—then that believer must live a SPIRIT-FILLED life. This was the secret of Jesus' victorious walk over sin, death, the grave, and everything else in existence.

We can capture the Spirit-filled life in key themes. The first is A Life of Surrender. Galatians 2:20 puts it plainly: "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." Living the Spirit-filled life means yielding your will, desires, and choices to God. Rather than living by self, you live by the Spirit. The awareness of His presence in you keeps you fully surrendered. You permit Him to take charge of your life.

As we yield gradually we will discover that the battlefield of the mind is often the greatest struggle for believers. Our minds are easily swayed by what we see, hear, and perceive around us. Many grow more conscious of natural happenings than of the Spirit within. But we must allow the Word of God daily to guard and direct the traffic of thoughts in our minds, so the Spirit can rule us completely.

Prayers: Holy Spirit, I yield myself to You in surrender to Your control.

## THE SPIRIT - FILED LIFE : A LIFE OF OBEDIENCE



This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh. For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would. Galatians 5:16-17

### Today's Reflection: Walk in obedience to God's Word

Do you know that the highest expression of love for God is obedience? When we claim to love Him, the true proof is living a life of total submission to His Word and commands. Sadly, many believers today have downplayed the call to obedience. These are lessons often emphasized in Sunday schools for children and young people, yet they remain vital in shaping the Christian walk. The reality is that many believers still struggle when it comes to obeying God's Word in practical matters.

A life of obedience is a key mark of living a SPIRIT-FILLED life. Such a believer walks in step with God's Word and quickly responds to the Spirit's leading, even when it challenges personal comfort. Romans 8:14 says, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." It is those who yield to the Spirit's direction in true obedience that God calls His sons. Obedience is not only about big spiritual decisions; it shows up in daily life—choosing forgiveness when wronged, walking in integrity at work, resisting compromise, and honoring God in speech and conduct.

So then, are you walking in genuine obedience to God and His Word? Or are you compromising in areas where His standard is clear? How committed are you to upright living? God has always been clear about the blessing that follows obedience. Throughout Scripture, He shows that He hates disobedience but delights in the obedience of His children. That is why He gave us the Holy Spirit to enable us.

Prayer: Lord, give me the grace to live in obedience to You daily.



### THE SPIRIT - FILED LIFE: A LIFE OF HOLINESS

Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God. 2 Corinthians 7:1

## Today's Reflection: Holiness is God's nature and we are God's children.

A Spirit-filled life is a Christ-centered life. It is lived in continual fellowship with God, reflecting His nature, and carrying His power to influence others and glorify Him. Living a Spirit-filled life will ultimately lead to holy living because the Spirit of the Lord is the Spirit of Holiness. Therefore, the true cure for unholy living is a life filled and directed by the Spirit.

The Spirit enables believers to rise above sin and walk in purity. Holiness is not only about avoiding evil but also about being set apart for God. "But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do." (1 Peter 1:15–16). True holiness goes beyond saying no to sin; it is a life fully devoted to God. The Spirit strengthens us to resist evil and remain pure in a corrupt world. Holiness becomes the evidence that the Spirit is at work within us, shaping us into Christ's likeness, and it brings peace and joy to the believer's walk.

The Spirit also helps us crucify fleshly desires. Romans 8:13 says, "For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live." To mortify means to put to death the appetites of the flesh that pull us into sin and carnality. This is why we must examine our daily choices—what we watch, the words we speak, and the relationships we build. Ask yourself, "Does this reflect Christ's holiness?" It is the Spirit who empowers us to overcome sin, producing purity and godly character that pleases the Lord.

Prayers: Lord, purify my heart and help me to live a holy life that pleases You.

Anniversary Outreach to Saturate 36 States and the FCT this October

The Perfection Daily Devotional (PDD), birthed by divine instruction in October 2017, is marking its 8th anniversary with a nationwide outreach coinciding with Nigeria's Independence Day.

What began in 2017 as a few hundred struggling copies has, by God's grace, grown into a movement. A major turning point came in 2022 when the devotional shifted to free distribution, opening doors into military and paramilitary formations across states. In 2024, PDD reached all 36 states and the FCT, and in 2025, it has already spread into four neighboring African nations.

The October outreach carries a fresh mandate: complete coverage of Nigeria once again, while saturating the city of Kaduna—its headquarters—with the gospel. "From universities to hospitals, prisons to communities, we are covering the whole city," the vision bearer affirmed.

Testimonies continue to flow in: inmates released after finding Christ through the devotional, miraculous healings, and churches adopting PDD as their daily fellowship guide. "The 8th anniversary is our launchpad into greater African territories. There is a sense of urgency—the Lord wants us to finish the work," he added.

To partners and readers, the closing note is clear: "Thank you. God bless you. Keep reading, keep growing in the faith, and keep practicing the Word."

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## A LIFE BEARING FRUIT



But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. Galatians 5:22–23

### Today's Reflection: The Spirit-filled life is known by its fruit.

The true evidence of a Spirit-filled life is not just in spiritual gifts, power, or even ministry activity, but in the fruit that the Spirit produces within a believer. Gifts can be imitated, but fruit cannot be faked. A tree is known by what it bears, and in the same way, a believer is recognized by the fruit of the Spirit at work in their daily living. When the Spirit fills a life, His nature begins to flow out through love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Each of these fruit reveals Christ's character. Love shows His heart, joy reflects His presence, peace reveals His authority, and patience displays His nature of mercy. Kindness and goodness demonstrate His compassion, while faithfulness points to His trustworthiness. Gentleness expresses His humility, and self-control reflects His mastery over sin. These are not achieved by human effort but are the natural result of walking in the Spirit. A Spirit-filled believer may face trials, but even in pressure, these fruit will shine because the Spirit supplies the strength.

Therefore, we must daily ask ourselves: What fruit am I bearing? Are people encountering Christ through my character of love and patience, or do they see anger, strife, and selfishness? Jesus said in Luke 6:44 "For every tree is known by his own fruit..." John 15:5, "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing." Our part is to remain connected to Him through His Spirit. As we abide, the Spirit nurtures and grows His fruit in us, making us living witnesses of Christ to the world.

Prayer: Holy Spirit, make my life fruitful. Help me to bear the fruit that reflects Christ daily.

## FRIDAY 17

### A LIFE OF PRAYER AND WORSHIP

Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Romans 8:26 KJV

## Today's Reflection: A Spirit-filled life is a praying and worshipping life.

One clear mark of a Spirit-filled believer is a life of prayer. On our own, we are weak in prayer—we get tired, distracted, or limited in words. But the Holy Spirit quickens us to pray beyond our weakness. He intercedes through us, giving us utterance and direction in prayer. A Spirit-filled life is never dry in prayer because the Spirit supplies strength, burden, and fire to stay connected with God. The desire for God through instrumentality of the Holy Spirit will compel the man to pray daily.

The Spirit also helps us worship God the way He desires. True worship is not about songs, posture, or mood; it is about worshipping God in spirit and in truth. When the Spirit fills your life, your worship goes beyond lips to become an offering of the heart. You worship with sincerity, not performance; with truth, not pretense. This is the kind of worship that pleases God.

Prayer and worship go hand in hand for the Spirit-filled believer. Through prayer, you fellowship and align with God's will; through worship, you honor and magnify His greatness, with these, we experience a deep connection with the divine. Together, they keep your heart sensitive, your faith strong, and your life burning with God's presence. A Spirit-filled life without prayer and worship will soon grow cold. But with them, you carry God's atmosphere everywhere you go.

Prayers: Holy Spirit, help me to pray and worship beyond myself. Let my life be full of true prayer and worship unto God.

## THE OLD MAN IS DEAD



Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. Romans 6:6

### Today's Reflection: light has come

The Old Man, as put forward by Paul the apostle, refers to the sinful human nature we all inherited from Adam (Romans 5:12). This nature is bent towards sin and radically corrupt. The Bible describes what humanity looked like under this nature: "They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one. There is no fear of God before their eyes" (Romans 3:12, 18). This remains the condition of every human until they come to Christ.

When anyone comes to Christ by believing in Him, something radical takes place. Eternal life is imparted into the spirit of such a person, making them alive to God (John 3:16). The Bible tells us that a new creature emerges and old things pass away, all things becoming new (2 Corinthians 5:17). The birth of this new creature (the New Man) also marks the death of the Old Man. Glory hallelujah! This is the truth revealed in our opening verse. Everyone who has put their faith in God for the salvation of their soul has had their Old Man—the sinful nature inherited from Adam—crucified.

Beloved, this is a vital truth that every Christian must know and believe unwaveringly. Now that we are new creatures with the Old Man dead and buried, it is our responsibility to put off all the sinful habits left behind by the Old Man (Romans 6:1–6; Colossians 3:9–10; Ephesians 4:22). We should not permit sin to reign in our lives, because we are free from sin and now have grace that empowers us to say no to sinful desires (Romans 6:14, 22; Titus 2:11). What a joy!

Prayers: Father, help me to live out this truth.



## **CREATED TO BE LIKE GOD**

Put on your new nature, created to be like God—truly righteous and holy. Ephesians 4:24 NLT

### Today's Reflection: the divine nature

Human nature is the basic makeup of what it means to be human. It includes our natural and inborn qualities, like how we tend to think, feel, and behave. But Peter tells us something huge when he wrote — "Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." (2 Peter 1:4). The divine nature? Did he mean a nature superior to human nature? Yes!

We should remember that God's original plan was to create man in His image and likeness — having His divine nature (Genesis 1:26–27). Unfortunately, sin corrupted this nature; man fell, and the image of God he once had was altered. But thanks be to God, Christ came to restore that which was lost. Everyone who believes in Him becomes a new creature, given the privilege to be a partaker of the divine nature — "the God-kind."

Two cardinal manifestations of the divine nature are righteousness and true holiness. These are attributes of God that He graciously wants us to share with Him (1 Peter 1:16). To live like God, we must stay close to Him through fervent prayers and consistent meditation in the Word of God (1 Thessalonians 5:18, Joshua 1:8), practicing the things the Word tells us as we allow the Holy Spirit to lead us daily. We should also surround ourselves with godly believers, for iron sharpens iron (Proverbs 27:17). Beloved, if we continue in these, we will be changed progressively to look like Christ, who is the express image of the Father (2 Corinthians 3:18). Just as the Bible puts it — until we reach the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4:13).

Prayers: Lord, help me to progressively look like You.

## GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 1: A CELEBRATION OF THE GOSPEL

Today's Reflection: The gospel — the best news ever, share it

We are excited! It's Missions Week for October — a week of rejoicing and renewed commitment to proclaiming the gospel. Let's invite others to join this week-long celebration of the Word as we prepare our hearts for the Lord's return.

Celebrating the gospel is a fitting way to begin. The word "gospel" literally means good news, and no news in all human history comes close. Though first announced over 2000 years ago, it remains front-page news, proclaimed daily by millions. The angels in our opening verse described it as "good tidings of great joy." The birth of the Saviour is central to the gospel message, so the heavenly host could not help but celebrate.

Millennia later, we are still celebrating this good news. Here it is in brief—
"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). That is the gospel in a nutshell: God's rescue plan for all people. One powerful way to celebrate is by sharing it. Tell it to everyone you can. Like Paul the apostle, be unashamed of the gospel, for it is God's power unto salvation. Let's take up a mission challenge this week — Don't let the gospel stop with you; pass it on. Hand out or forward the devotional to seven people this week.

## GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 2: SPEAK THE WORD WITH BOLDNESS

And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness. — Acts 4:31

### Today's Reflection: when the Spirit fills you, fear flees

In our mission this year to spread the gospel message into the 36 states of Nigeria and the FCT through the Perfection Daily Devotional, a brother decided to distribute free copies in the megacity of Lagos. In his testimony, he said he spent time praying for divine direction on what locations to cover. Soon after, he hit the streets. As he moved, he was inspired to enter a police station. When he offered to distribute the devotional to the officers, they were surprised. They never imagined someone would walk into a police station for the gospel's sake. Yet they gave him an audience and gladly received free copies.

This was how the apostles shared the word of God with boldness. They seized every opportunity the Lord provided to preach the gospel message — unashamedly and to all people. Whenever you sense the Spirit prompting you to share the gospel, never hold back. He will put the right words in your mouth. Beloved, be bold!

Prayers: Father, I boldly declare that I am bold as a lion.

## GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 3: DISCOVERING THE SCOPE OF YOUR ASSIGNMENT



Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work. — John 4:34

## Today's Reflection: Your assignment has a scope—have you discovered it?

At one time, the Lord told Joshua that despite his advanced age and great accomplishments, there was still much land remaining to be taken and possessed by the Israelites (Joshua 13:1). The task of fully possessing the promised land was not complete; much land was yet to be claimed and divided among the tribes.

Considering how much Joshua had already accomplished—defeating 31 kings on both sides of the Jordan—one would suppose that this highly decorated war general had done more than enough. Yet God reminded him that the work was not finished. This reveals God's mind regarding the things He entrusts to us: His expectation is always that we complete the task. As our opening verse shows, Jesus lived for one passion with two inseparable goals—to do the Father's will and to finish it. He gave it everything, even if it meant preaching to the Samaritan woman while hungry and thirsty. That satisfied Him more.

Beloved, are you aware of the task the Master has left us? He gave us the assignment of making disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18–20). He desires that all men be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. Do you know what portion of this great work has been entrusted to you? What has God told you to achieve for Him? If you do not yet know, keep trusting God in prayer until He reveals the scope of your life's assignment. This will give direction to your entire pursuit, helping you serve the will of God with focus and finish it. As you seek clarity, remain faithful in serving wherever you are.

Prayer: Lord, open my eyes to the scope of my assignment, and help me to finish it.



### GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 4: THE FULL PREACHING OF THE GOSPEL

Through mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God; so that from Jerusalem, and round about unto Illyricum, I have fully preached the gospel of Christ. —Romans 15:19

### Today's Reflection: it can be done by us.

Through the light of Scripture, we strongly believe that we are in the last few years before the rapture. This calls for urgency in the spirit to complete the full preaching of the gospel committed to us—individually, collectively as a local church, and globally as the body of Christ in the earth. Yet many believers have not caught this burden deeply in their hearts. The Lord is calling us higher.

Did you see Paul's testimony in our opening verse? He judged himself to have fully preached the gospel from Jerusalem and round about Illyricum by the power of the Spirit. This was a vast geographical scope of Paul's apostolic mission. In his time—without cars, planes, or digital media—Paul still covered more than 10,000 miles, testifying across the Mediterranean world. What excuse do we have in our own time of advanced communication?

Beloved, let us desire Paul's testimony and decide that we too will fully preach the gospel in the territory the Lord designates to us. We must trust God for Spirit-inspired ways to deliberately fill our territories with the teachings of the gospel. From personal evangelism and crusades to TV and radio ministries to social media campaigns, let's determine to leave no stone unturned. Our responsibility is simply to be compassionate witnesses; it is the work of the Holy Spirit to bring conviction to the hearts of men. Let us devote ourselves to the goal of fully preaching the gospel.

Prayers: Lord, I believe that we too can fully preach the gospel.

### GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 5: GIVE TO THE PREACHING OF THE GOSPEL



Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7

### Today's Reflection: giving fuels the gospel

It's common knowledge that the gospel is free, but the means of preaching it isn't. From the days of our Lord Jesus, the preaching of the gospel was funded by people. The Bible tells us about Joanna, the wife of Chuza, Herod's business manager; Susanna; and many others who contributed from their own resources to support Jesus and His disciples (Luke 8:3 NLT). If the Lord required resources for the preaching of the gospel, then money is indeed an important factor.

When our heart is for the gospel of our Lord Jesus, our resources will naturally flow in that direction. King David's testimony mirrors this truth: "And now, because of my devotion to the Temple of my God, I am giving all of my own private treasures of gold and silver to help in the construction. This is in addition to the building materials I have already collected for his holy Temple." (1 Chronicles 29:3 NLT). What a heart David had for God! No wonder he was called a man after God's heart.

Beloved, we must recognize that it is our responsibility to fund the things of God, for we are only stewards of the resources at our disposal. God wants us to be cheerful givers who give generously with great enthusiasm. The more we give, the more we become channels for God to fund His will and purposes here on earth, just like King David. So what kingdom cause do you devote your giving to? If you don't have any, now is the best time to start. Nothing is too big or too little to give to the Lord.

### **GLOBAL MISSIONS WEEK DAY 6: PRAY**

### Today's Reflection: prayer works!

When the Lord gave the vision for the Perfection Daily Devotional eight years ago, we were only publishing a few hundred copies for local distribution within our church. Despite the few copies printed, it hardly spread within our church family. Then in 2022, the Lord gave us by revelation the very prayer Paul requested of the Thessalonians — "...that the Lord's message will spread rapidly and be honored wherever it goes..." We began to say this prayer daily.

From the moment we started praying this scripture, things changed dramatically. The reach of the devotional surged almost instantly. From paramilitary institutions to correctional centers, churches, fellowships, schools, and hospitals, the Perfection Daily Devotional gained rapid access. In 2024, for the first time, the devotional spread into 36 states and the FCT in a grand move by the power of the Holy Ghost. This year, by divine orchestration, the devotional entered four neighboring African countries.

In just three years, the word of God in the devotional spread rapidly and was greatly honored everywhere it went. With prayer, what could not spread among a few hundred people has now reached tens of thousands across multiple nations. ### Today's Reflection: glorious things await us.

Daily we draw closer to the rapture of the saints. The miraculous catching away of believers in Christ. The Bible describes it this way — "For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet call of God. First, the believers who have died will rise from their graves. Then, together with them, we who are still alive and remain on the earth will be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Then we will be with the Lord forever. (1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 NLT). Just after this glorious event comes the Marriage Feast of the Lamb.

The Marriage Feast of the Lamb occurs in heaven after the Rapture, with the Church presented as Christ's bride. While the Great Tribulation unfolds on Earth, the saints are judged for their works and rewarded with fine linen. The marriage feast follows, celebrating the eternal union of Christ with all believers. Christ then returns with his bride to begin his thousand-year (millennial) reign on Earth. The feast marks the culmination of redemption and the beginning of Christ's triumph and reign.

Beloved, glorious things await us. This is why we must endure hardship and persecution for the sake of Christ. The Bible already tells us that through much tribulation we will enter the kingdom of God (Acts 14:22). Let's stay strong in faith, serving the Lord in truth, as we faithfully await His return.

Prayers: Lord, keep me standing as I await Your glorious return.



## **INNOVATE BY THE HOLY GHOST**

But the anointing which ye have received of him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him. 1 John 2:27

### Today's Reflection: be inspired by the Holy Ghost.

One of the greatest blessings in Christ is the Holy Ghost — the very Spirit of God Himself. What a gracious gift given to us by the Father, to everyone who puts their faith in Jesus Christ our Lord (Ephesians 1:13). The Father did this so that we would never be alone on the journey of life — One who abides with us forever (John 14:16-18).

In emphasizing this truth, John the beloved tells us something powerful in our opening verse — "an anointing that teaches us all things." Ponder this for a moment. See how the Amplified version renders it: "As for you, the anointing [the special gift, the preparation] which you received from Him remains [permanently] in you, and you have no need for anyone to teach you. But just as His anointing teaches you [giving you insight through the presence of the Holy Spirit] about all things, and is true and is not a lie, and just as His anointing has taught you, you must remain in Him [being rooted in Him, knit to Him]." (1 John 2:27 AMP).

This is huge. It means we have access to divine insights on all matters by the Holy Ghost — insights for life and godliness, science and technology, business and career, governance and leadership, just name it! Beloved, we must take advantage of this unparalleled privilege and build a robust relationship with the Holy Ghost through consistent prayers, study of the Word, deep meditation, and above all, prompt obedience to His leading at all times. Like Daniel and Bezalel in the Bible, we can innovate by the Holy Ghost (Daniel 6:3; Exodus 31).

Prayers: Lord, I declare that I am inspired by the Holy Ghost.

### WE ARE THE BLESSED ONES



Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ: Ephesians 1:3

### Today's Reflection: we believe so we speak.

What we received in Christ Jesus is beyond what our human minds can fully comprehend. The best we know right now is still just a part of all that there is (1 Corinthians 13:9). Scriptures like our opening verse can keep one in a world of endless imaginations — "blessed with all spiritual blessings." When we begin to understand the intent of the mind of God for those of us who believe, we will come to realize that God designed us for a life of fullness, with nothing lacking, nothing wanting.

All spiritual blessings mean all! It denotes that everything that is called a blessing has been conferred on us in Christ Jesus. It's unfortunate how the devil limits the minds of believers and keeps them from seeing the heights, breadths, and lengths — all of the dimensions of God's goodness. From the blessing of grace that brings salvation, to the blessings of divine health and healing, to the blessing that makes a man rich and adds no sorrow — just name it (Ephesians 2:8, 1 Peter 2:24, Proverbs 10:22).

Note that the Bible didn't tell us this blessing is something we have to beg God for. No! We have been blessed — that's what the Bible says. All we need to do is believe like our father Abraham. He believed, and it was counted to him for righteousness. If we believe, then we must keep speaking forth these blessings over our lives daily (2 Corinthians 4:13). There is a daily confession right at the middle page of this devotional. Make it a practice to declare those words of blessing over your life daily. Shalom!
